Criteria for a Research Project:

- 1. Research projects should expose the scholar to hypothesis testing, research design, data collection and analysis and interpretation.
- 2. Projects (sub-projects) which can be completed in the ten-week program time are encouraged.
- 3. All staff submitting research projects must have a faculty appointment.
- 4. A staff member may submit more than one research project, with the understanding that they will be supervising more than one student.
- 5. A Fellow is encouraged to submit a research project, but needs approval and co-sponsorship.
- 6. Preceptors with planned vacations during the ten-week program must arrange for alternative research supervision.
